LeMoine Fitzgerald, who was the last member to join Canada's famous group of artist, the "Group of Seven", lived at #30 Deer Lodge Place. Fitzgerald's painting, "Doc Snyder's House" hangs in the National Gallery. Other works can be seen at the St. James Library and Winnipeg Art Gallery.

### Trail Features

- Parking:** Park along Deer Lodge Pl or at Bruce Park
- Distance:** ~0.4 km from Bruce Park Parking Lot to 30 Deer Lodge Pl
- Surface Type:** City sidewalks
- Suitable For:** Walking, cycling.
- Seasons:** Open year around.
- Amenities:** N/A



## Bruce Park

This 13 acre park on the banks of Truro Creek is a showpiece with ancient trees, plantings of blue spruce and clump birch, wild roses, an ornamental footbridge, and rolling landscape. Peter Bruce originally settled the land in the 1850's. In 1928 and 1929, the City of St. James acquired the bulk of the land. A cenotaph was erected in 1936 as a centrepiece in the park to honour the soldiers who fell in World War 1. This monument ultimately stood for more than 50 years until frost damage destroyed it in the 1980's. In 1990, the original cenotaph was replaced, at the initiative of the St. James Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion, by a replica that honoured the veterans of the three major wars in this century. In 1992, the "Friends of Bruce Park" were formed to help preserve and protect the park.

### Bruce Park Features

- Parking:** The park has a Parking Lot off of Albany St
- Distance:** ~ 1 km worth of trails within the park
- Surface Type:** Asphalt
- Suitable For:** Walking, cycling
- Seasons:** Open year around, regular trail users' compact snow in winter.
- Amenities:** Playground, picnic tables, benches



## The Gardens of Douglas Park Rd

Follow paths through Bruce Park, cross the creek bridge and exit at the back lane of Portage Ave near the north end of the park. Proceed down the lane to the library; then turn right and follow an informal path along the back gardens of Douglas Park Road. You'll be rewarded with a terrific view of the massive lots and beautiful gardens on this street.

### Trail Features

- Parking:** Parking lot at Bruce Park
- Distance:** 2 km round trip
- Surface Type:** mowed grass. No formal path.
- Suitable For:** Walking.
- Seasons:** Spring, Summer and Fall.
- Amenities:** Washroom at Public Library.



A walk by the Bourkevale Community Club in the right season may offer you a glimpse of the stately game of Lawn Bowling. The club has an active contingent of bowlers who put on a fine show on many a summer afternoon. Between the dike and the Assiniboine River is a designated “off-leash dog area” under the City of Winnipeg’s Fields for Fido program.

### Trail Features

- Parking:** Parking lot at Bruce Park
- Distance:** ~0.5 km from parking lot to the Community Club
- Surface Type:** limestone, mowed grass on dike
- Suitable For:** Walking, cycling
- Seasons:** Open year around, trail users compact snow in winter.
- Amenities:** Benches, picnic tables, off-leash dog area
