



The Cornish Path was once a gravel trail built alongside the Assiniboine River. Over the years it has gradually washed away and now it is a footpath used by pedestrians and cyclists. Local groups bark chip it after the high waters subside. It is a beautiful route weaving through river bottom forest.

**Parking:** Multiple parking locations on neighbouring side streets.

**Asphalt Trail Distance** ~1.4 km return from Cornish park

**Surface Type:** Bark chip

**Suitable For:** Walking

**Seasons:** Summer, fall, winter
